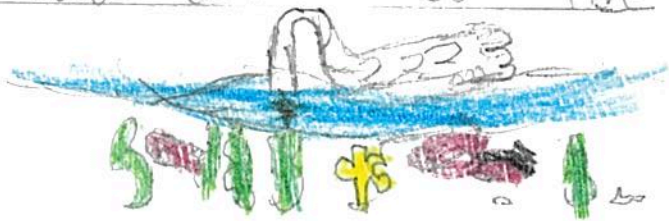
I enjoyed learning about bronze it can be used lots of different ways just like art with birds on it.



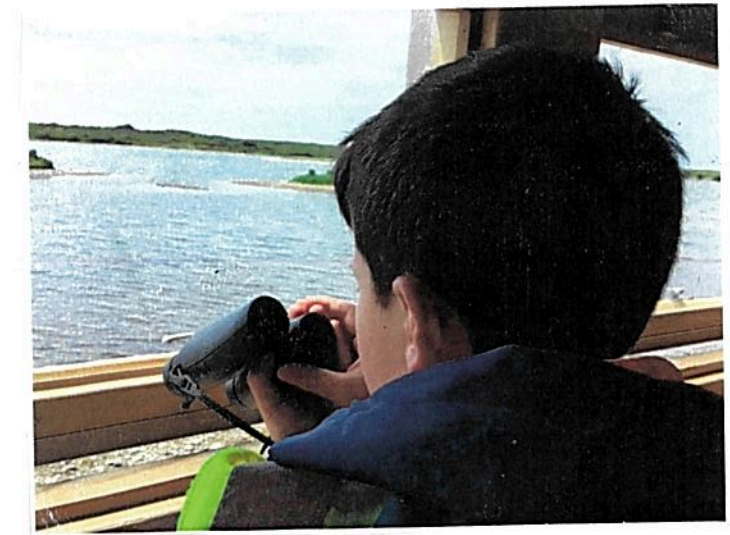
It is is important that birds nest so we can't make noise, shhhhhhhhh!

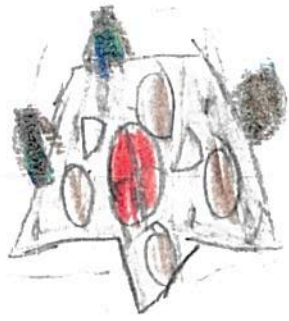


I enjoyed learning that flowers can attract bugs so birds can eat them to live

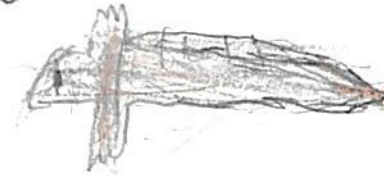


I saw lots of birds even a beautiful swan. The swan dipped its head into the lagoon to get food like insects and plants, not meat.

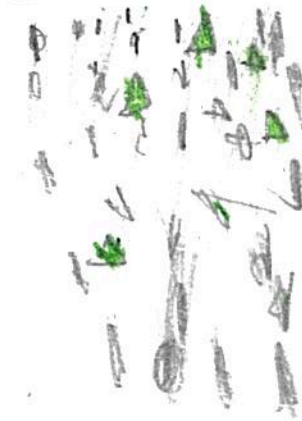
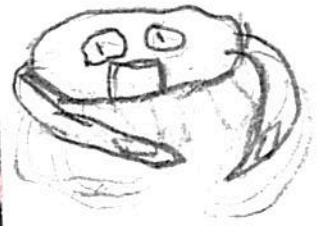




Ramsey Shoreline



I enjoyed learning about blennys, Did you know that they are covered in snot so they can't dry up and they are poisonous to fish.



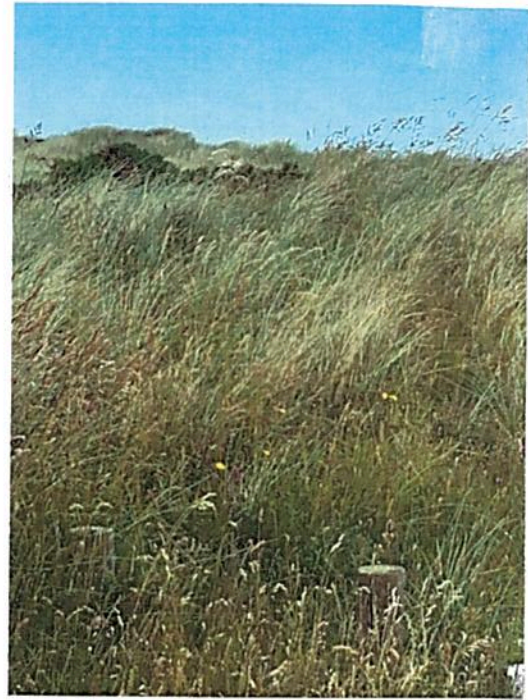
It is important that anemones don't dry up, they have to stay damp but when it feels scared it will release water.

It is important other birds and people stay away so the oyster catcher get alert or you will be scared like this rook getting a scare

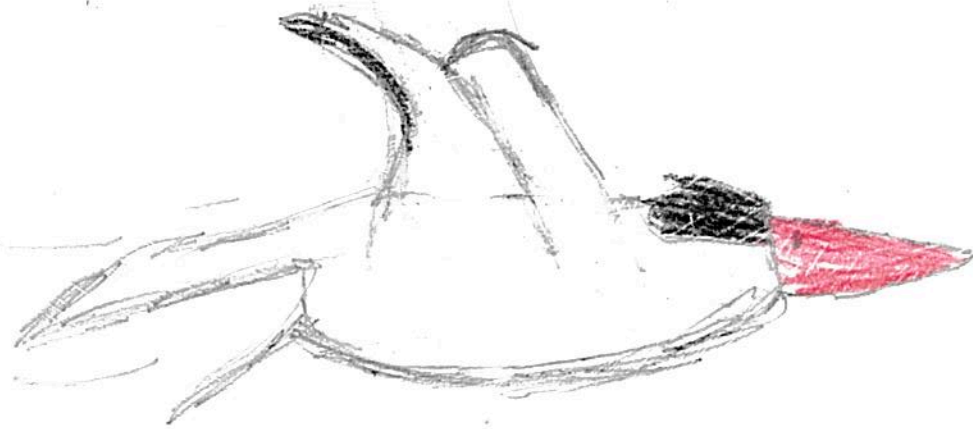


The Shore at the Point of Ayre Lighthouse
