

#### Summary of bird sightings in the Isle of Man, April 2024

**Brent Goose** – The highest count from the month was on 8<sup>th</sup> with 124 at Langness. The last birds recorded at Langness were on 25<sup>th</sup> with 37 still present; 19 were also at Strandhall on that day.

**Wigeon** – Late remaining birds included two at Strandhall on 11<sup>th</sup>, one at Glascoe on 13<sup>th</sup>, two at Pooilvaaish on 18<sup>th</sup> and a single drake remained at Langness up to 23<sup>rd</sup>.

**Gadwall** A pair were at Pooilvaaish on 25<sup>th</sup>, then at Langness on 28<sup>th</sup>. A drake was in pools at Cranstal on 24<sup>th</sup>.

**Long-tailed Duck** – The male at Derbyhaven continued to be reported through the month.

**Red-breasted Merganser** – A drake was present at Langness from 10<sup>th</sup> to 13<sup>th</sup>.

**Goosander** – A drake was present on Kerrowdhoo Reservoir on 23<sup>rd</sup>.

**Alpine Swift\*** - A possible Alpine Swift was reported from Fleshwick on 7<sup>th</sup>.

**Swift** – Early returning birds were reported from Point of Ayre on 21<sup>st</sup>, Dalby Mountain on 25th and over Peel on 30<sup>th</sup>.

Purple Sandpiper – The high count came again from Port St Mary of 26 on 24th.

**Common Sandpiper** – The first record was a single at Pooilvaaish on 11<sup>th</sup>. Two were seen at Port Soldrick on 18<sup>th</sup>. Kionslieu saw one on 19<sup>th</sup>, three on 21<sup>st</sup> with two again on 23<sup>rd</sup> & 26<sup>th</sup>.

**Black-tailed Godwit** – At Langness one was present on 9<sup>th</sup>, seven on 27<sup>th</sup>, two on 28<sup>th</sup> and 14 on 30<sup>th</sup>. In the north a single was on the Ballaghennie backslacks on 19<sup>th</sup> and four were on the Glascoe floods on 24<sup>th</sup>.

**Greenshank** – The overwintering bird was last noted at Langness on 6<sup>th</sup>.

**Great Skua** – Sightings from Fort Island on 13<sup>th</sup> & 17<sup>th</sup>. A single was also seen off Marine Drive on 27<sup>th</sup>.

**Great Crested Grebe** – An adult bird was present in Derbyhaven Bay on 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup>, and adult also seen in Douglas Bay on 13th.

Slavonian Grebe\* - A breeding plumage adult was in Derbyhaven Bay on 5th

**Sandwich Tern** – Off Gansey a single on 5<sup>th</sup>, two on 9<sup>th</sup> & 15<sup>th</sup>. The highest count from Peel Bay was eight on 23<sup>rd</sup> & 24<sup>th</sup>. Along the north coast Rue Point saw the highest counts with 43 on 19<sup>th</sup> and 47 on 22<sup>nd</sup>.

**Little Tern** – The first sighting at Rue Point was a single on 21<sup>st</sup>, two were also seen off the Lhen on that day. By 24<sup>th</sup> 10 were at Rue Point.

Marsh Harrier\* - An individual was seen over the Point of Ayre on 19th.

**Osprey** – A bird was seen off the Lhen on 19<sup>th</sup>, which flew north-east and seen passing the Point of Ayre a short time later.

**Cuckoo** – The first record came on 13<sup>th</sup> from Greeba Curragh, after which birds were heard near Dhoon Glen on 21<sup>st</sup> and the Lhen on 30<sup>th</sup>. Individuals were seen at Ballakesh on 22<sup>nd</sup> and Meayll Hill,



Cregneash on the morning of 28<sup>th</sup>. A single bird was heard from Arrasey Plantation and surrounds from 24<sup>th</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Whitethroat** – The first of the year was recorded at MBLPOANR on 20<sup>th</sup>. Single birds were at Ballachurry on 21<sup>st</sup>, Derbyhaven on 24<sup>th</sup>, Niarbyl on 26<sup>th</sup> and Perwick on 27<sup>th</sup> & 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Sedge Warbler** – The first of the year was heard at Lhagagh Mooar (Andreas) on 14<sup>th</sup>, the first bird at Ballachurry was seen on 16<sup>th</sup>.

**Grasshopper Warbler** – Single birds heard from Greeba Curragh and Langness on 13<sup>th</sup>. Birds were heard at Kentraugh from 19<sup>th</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup>. A bird was reeling at Kionslieu on 19<sup>th</sup> & 20<sup>th</sup>.

**Tree Pipit\*** - Birds were seen or heard over MBLPOANR several times in the latter half of the month.

**Redwing** – A late bird was seen at the Point of Ayre on 24<sup>th</sup>, and a flock of 38 were recorded near Patrick on 26<sup>th</sup>.

Tree Sparrow\* - Three birds were seen at Ballachurry on 25th.

Twite – A late flock remained at Pooilvaaish with 10 on 11<sup>th</sup>, and nine still on 18<sup>th</sup>.

**Crossbill** – Sightings from Conrhenny Plantation from 23<sup>rd</sup> to 26<sup>th</sup>, and nine in Arrasey Plantation on 27<sup>th</sup>.

#### Calf of Man Interesting Sightings, April 2024

April 2024 saw a record high variety for the month of April with 104 species recorded.

**Tufted Duck** – An unusual sighting for the Calf with two seen on a seawatch on 9<sup>th</sup>.

**Cuckoo** – The first of the year was on 22<sup>nd</sup>, with two recorded on 24<sup>th</sup> and a single on 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Swift** – A single bird was recorded over South Harbour on 22<sup>nd</sup>.

**Grey Plover** – A single bird was seen flying up the Glen on 20<sup>th</sup>.

Common Sandpiper – The first was reported on 19th, with two present on 20th.

Little Egret – One was seen on 16<sup>th</sup>.

**Great Spotted Woodpecker** – The bird first observed in March remained on the Calf until at least 17<sup>th</sup>.

**Great Skua** – The first sighting of the single bird came on 18<sup>th</sup> and recorded regularly thereafter.

Ring Ouzel – Single birds were recorded on 1st, 2nd, 6th, 15th & 18th.

**Spotted Flycatcher** – The first of the year was caught and ringed on 30<sup>th</sup>.

Black Redstart – An adult male was seen near the observatory on 23rd.

**Redstart** – A female was caught and ringed on 27<sup>th</sup>.

Whinchat – Two records of singles on 21st & 26th.

Firecrest\* - A bird was caught and ringed on 23rd.

**Grasshopper Warbler** – The first of the year came on 13<sup>th</sup>, singles then recorded on 14th, 20<sup>th</sup> & 23<sup>rd</sup>; two recorded on both 26<sup>th</sup> & 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Sedge Warbler** – The first two were recorded on 13<sup>th</sup>, though numbers were low for the remainder of the month.

Garden Warbler – One bird was caught and ringed on 26th, two on 30th.

Whitethroat – The 22<sup>nd</sup> saw the first record of two, the 28<sup>th</sup> seeing the highest count of nine.

**Lesser Whitethroat** – A single bird was caught and ringed on 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Tree Pipit\*** - A single on 6<sup>th</sup> was first of the year, with three recorded on 18<sup>th</sup> and two on 26<sup>th</sup>.

**Twite** – A late single bird was observed on 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup>.
