

#### Summary of bird sightings in the Isle of Man, May 2024

Pink-footed Goose – A late bird remained at POANR up to 5<sup>th</sup>.

Wigeon – A late drake was at Langness on 15th. A pair were at POANR until 25<sup>th</sup>.

**Long-tailed Duck** – The long staying male was last noted at Derbyhaven on 6<sup>th</sup>, while the female at POANR was noted up to 25<sup>th</sup>.

**Grey Plover** – A single was at Langness on 6<sup>th</sup>.

Greenshank – A single at POANR on 10th.

Black-tailed Godwit – A single bird was at Poyll Brienn, Langness on 15th.

Little Stint – A single bird was among a large Dunlin flock at Sandwick from 6th to 11th.

**Ruff** – A single bird was on the floods at Glascoe on 7<sup>th</sup>.

**Knot** – A large flock of 187 flew past Sandwick on 22<sup>nd</sup>. Smaller numbers at Langness included two on 6<sup>th</sup> and singles on 10<sup>th</sup> & 18<sup>th</sup>; elsewhere one at Rue Point on 5<sup>th</sup> and five at Strandhall on 14<sup>th</sup>.

Great Crested Grebe - A single was present at POANR on 25th.

**Glossy Ibis\*** - The islands second record came with a bird seen on floods at Glascoe on 1<sup>st</sup> and remained until 4<sup>th</sup>.

**Great White Egret\*** - One overflew POA on 10<sup>th</sup>.

**Osprey** – Sightings of single birds came from a variety of locations; Rue Point on 5<sup>th</sup>, Gansey on 6<sup>th</sup>, north over St Johns on 7<sup>th</sup>, Peel and Derbyhaven on 17<sup>th</sup> and POANR on 25<sup>th</sup>.

**Red Kite\*** - Two were seen overflying Druidale on 11<sup>th</sup>. One flew north over the Howe, Cregneash on 20<sup>th</sup>.

**Arctic Skua** – A dark bird flew from Derbyhaven to Castletown Bay on 22<sup>nd</sup>.

**Swift** – After singles in Peel on 4<sup>th</sup> and Derbyhaven on 6<sup>th</sup>; from 8<sup>th</sup> onwards, birds were reported from their typical areas around Port Erin, Castletown, Douglas, Peel and Ramsey.

**Arctic Tern** – Two or three birds were present at Rue Point from 4<sup>th</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup>. Birds returned to POA by 22<sup>nd</sup>.

Rose-coloured Starling\* - An adult bird was seen at Langness on 6th.

**Bee-eater\*** - A single bird flew south over the Point of Ayre on 7<sup>th</sup>.

Golden Oriole\* - A bird was seen in POANR on 25th.

**Cuckoo** – Individuals were seen or heard calling at Druidale on 7<sup>th</sup>, Ballaghennie on 7<sup>th</sup> & 10<sup>th</sup>, Ballabeg on 10<sup>th</sup>, Earystane on 11<sup>th</sup>; and at Ballakilpheric and Dalby Mountain on 12<sup>th</sup>.

Wood Warbler\* - A single bird was present in POANR on 5th.

Pied Flycatcher\* - A female type was seen at POANR on 5<sup>th</sup>.



**Spotted Flycatcher** – Birds were also seen at POANR on 13<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup>. A single bird was in Howe Glen on 20<sup>th</sup> & 27<sup>th</sup>, with two there on 25<sup>th</sup>. A bird was seen at Ronague on 24<sup>th</sup>.

**Yellow Wagtail\*** - Several individuals were seen at the Glascoe floods. One *Flavissima* bird was present on  $2^{nd}$ , two on  $5^{th}$ . A potential *Iberiae* bird was present on  $3^{rd}$  &  $4^{th}$ .

Crossbill – Two were seen in Arrasey Plantation on 10<sup>th</sup>.

#### Calf of Man Interesting Sightings, May 2024

Cuckoo - One on 6th, 14th & 26th

**Water Rail** – Two adults were present all month and proven to breed. The first breeding record since 1994.

**Greenshank** – An unseasonal record of one on 25<sup>th</sup>.

Arctic Skua - One was noted on 31st.

**Bittern\*** - A bird was heard booming on the morning of 8<sup>th</sup>.

**Puffin** - The first of the year came on 3<sup>rd</sup>; singles noted again on 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup>. Two recorded on 18<sup>th</sup>, 19<sup>th</sup>, 21<sup>st</sup>; then four on 22<sup>nd</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup>.

Merlin - A late bird was still present on 9th

Osprey – One was noted on both 11<sup>th</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup>.

Red Kite – A bird was seen over the island on 10<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> and two were seen together on 20<sup>th</sup>.

**Short-eared Owl** – A bird was present on 5th and 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Woodlark\*** - One flew north over the Observatory on 8<sup>th</sup>.

**Spotted Flycatcher** -1 on  $5^{th}$ , 7 present on  $8^{th}$ , one again on  $12^{th}$ , three on  $13^{th}$ , two on  $15^{th}$ , three on  $21^{st}$ , seven on  $25^{th}$ , eight on  $26^{th}$ , six on  $27^{th}$ , four on 28th

Redstart - A single was recorded on 1st

Nightingale\* - An individual was caught and ringed on 15th.

Wood Warbler\* - A bird was caught and ringed on 6th.

**Grasshopper Warbler** – A single on 5th

Reed Warbler\* - Single birds caught and ringed on 1st, 2nd & 3rd. Three were recorded on 16th.

**Garden Warbler** – One on each of 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 13<sup>th</sup>, 14<sup>th</sup>, 17th

**Lesser Whitethroat** – Two were recorded on 1<sup>st</sup> and a single on 5<sup>th</sup>.

**Tree Sparrow\*** – One on 2<sup>nd</sup> followed by four on 3<sup>rd</sup>.

**Brambling** – A late individual was caught and ringed on 25<sup>th</sup>.

**Common Rosefinch\*** - A singing 'brown' male was caught and ringed on the morning of 25<sup>th</sup> and remained on 27<sup>th</sup>.
